

# Sun City West Metal Club

## Membership Meeting Minutes – February 14, 2008

The meeting was called to order at 11 a.m. by the President, Doc Gundersen with the repeating of *The Pledge of Allegiance*. A quorum was present.

After the minutes were read and accepted as presented, the Treasurers Report was also accepted as presented.

Reports were presented by the President and various Chairmen. They contained the following topics:

1. A meeting was held with the Rec. Center Officials and two specific SCW firemen are approved to use the Metal Club for Fire Dept. repairs only. A letter to that effect will be forthcoming.
2. A meeting was held with the Village Store people and the Rec. Center Officials. It was stressed that all sales must be through the Village Store and misuse of the sales process by our hobby clubs will not be tolerated. It was also pointed out that members may not accept tips for work done. Tips must go to the Treasurer.
3. Cell phones have been and still are, being collected for our soldiers by club members. Anyone having any unused cell phones was asked to bring them to the shop for distribution.
4. Because the Craft Fair will be held March 15<sup>th</sup>, a clear explanation of how to properly mark sales items was given. Volunteers for setting up should come to the location at 5 a.m.
5. The Wood Club and our Metal Club are paying for a combined ad for the Craft Shows. This will be in addition to advertising done by the Rec. Centers.
6. Progress on updating the Club's website at [www.scwmetalclub.com](http://www.scwmetalclub.com) was reported and members were asked to submit photos for the website.
7. Metal being stored in the shop is considered temporary and should be cleaned out regularly. Members were reminded that all scrap metal should be taken to the Monitors desk and weighed so that it can be paid for.
8. Richly deserved *Thank you's* were given to hard working club members who spend countless hours working for the betterment of the membership and club equipment.
9. Morning monitors will now be picking up the shop key from PORA. Reminder was again given that even though the monitor does arrive earlier to open up; members are not to come until the 8 a.m. opening time.
10. Because no used motor for our wet wheel could be found, a new motor will be ordered soon.

The President then introduced a member named *TIM*. He pointed out that *TIM* cannot read, follow instructions, or use equipment properly so *TIM* needs everyone's help. Sometimes *TIM* even takes items without paying for them. He then pointed out that *TIM* is The Invisible Man in our club. The solution to his problems is to report what he does to the Monitors.

The President next reported that the club picnic which will be held in the afternoon of March 30<sup>th</sup> at Beardsley Park will not be catered. A show of hands was asked for, in regards to hamburgers vs. hot dogs. Hamburgers clearly won until it was suggested that the hot dogs "be Brats".
